



What is the best way to take notes?

Taking notes is very difficult for many kids. For many of our Remote Learners this has been the first time a teacher has requested them to take notes and they are not sure what to write down.


- Explain to your child that whenever the teacher on the video writes something on the whiteboard, they need to stop the video and write it down!
